What to expect of the Self-Study Visit?

Self-Study Visit General Information

The MSC MSCHE Self-Study Visit will be on November 7-10, 2021. Due to the COVID-19 Pandemic, the site visit will be virtually utilizing the Zoom platform. The Self-Study Chair determines the agenda for the visit. Usually, there is a meeting with the Chancellor daily, and meetings with the Steering Committee, the MSC Deans, and the responsible individuals for compliance with each of the seven standards. The team will also meet with students and faculty representatives. Once the agenda is finalized, it will be posted as an Information Capsule. Participants will be notified in advanced of the date, time, role, and Zoom link. They will also participate of orientation sessions in preparation for the visit.

Self-Study Visit Team of Peer Evaluators Responsibilities

The Team of Peer Evaluators will revise the Self-Study Report and all the evidence submitted. During the virtual visit, team members will ask questions to confirm that the MSC complies with each of the accreditation standards and requirements of affiliation. The Team will develop an exit report for the MSC regarding the MSC reaffirmation based on the documents provided before the visit, during the visit, and the responses received.

After the Self-Study Visit

After the Self-Study Visit the Team writes a full report on its findings. This report will be sent to the MSC for evaluation and response to findings. Both reports will be submitted to the MSCHE for final evaluation and appropriate action. The Commission has the final decision-making authority regarding reaffirmation of accreditation.
