Program of Study DNP-NA

The Program is composed of eighty-seven (87) credits. Students should complete 1,071 didactic hours and 2,544 hours of clinical practice, including 1,152 hours of residency I & II. The maximum period to meet all didactic and clinical requirements is 54 months or 4.5 years.

All courses are delivered in Spanish. Tests, references, books, journals, and other printed material are in English.

Graduation Requirements

The candidate must have completed the didactic and clinical program requirements for granting the degree. It includes completion of 87 credits, for the degree, a GPA of 3.00 or above, approval of specialty coursed with a minimum of a B, completion of all didactic courses and clinical hours as specified by the NAP.

Admission Criteria

- Possess a Baccalaureate or Master degree in nursing from a nationally accredited program (CCNE or ACEN).
- A 3.00 GPA in general education courses, sciences, and nursing courses.
- Undergraduate Statistics and Chemistry courses with B grade or better (3 credits each).
- · English proficiency as evidenced by TOEFL (preferably a general score of 80 or above and a specific reading score of 20 or more). Required for students not completing high school or college education in the continental U.S.
- Demonstrate Spanish proficiency during the interview process.
- To comply with state laws, all students are required to be licensed as registered nurse in the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico. The license is required at the beginning of the study program.
- Must have a minimum of one year (two preferred) of full-time work experience (2,080hours), or its part-time equivalent, as a registered nurse in a critical care setting within the last five years.
- · Possess current competency in Basic Life Support (BLS), Advanced Cardiac Life Support (ACLS) and Pediatric Advanced Life Support certifications (PALS).

· Three letters of recommendation.

- a) most recent employer
- b) a health care professional preferably a licensed physician or a CRNA
- c) a teacher that can attest to the academic suitability of the candidate to pursue graduate education.
