

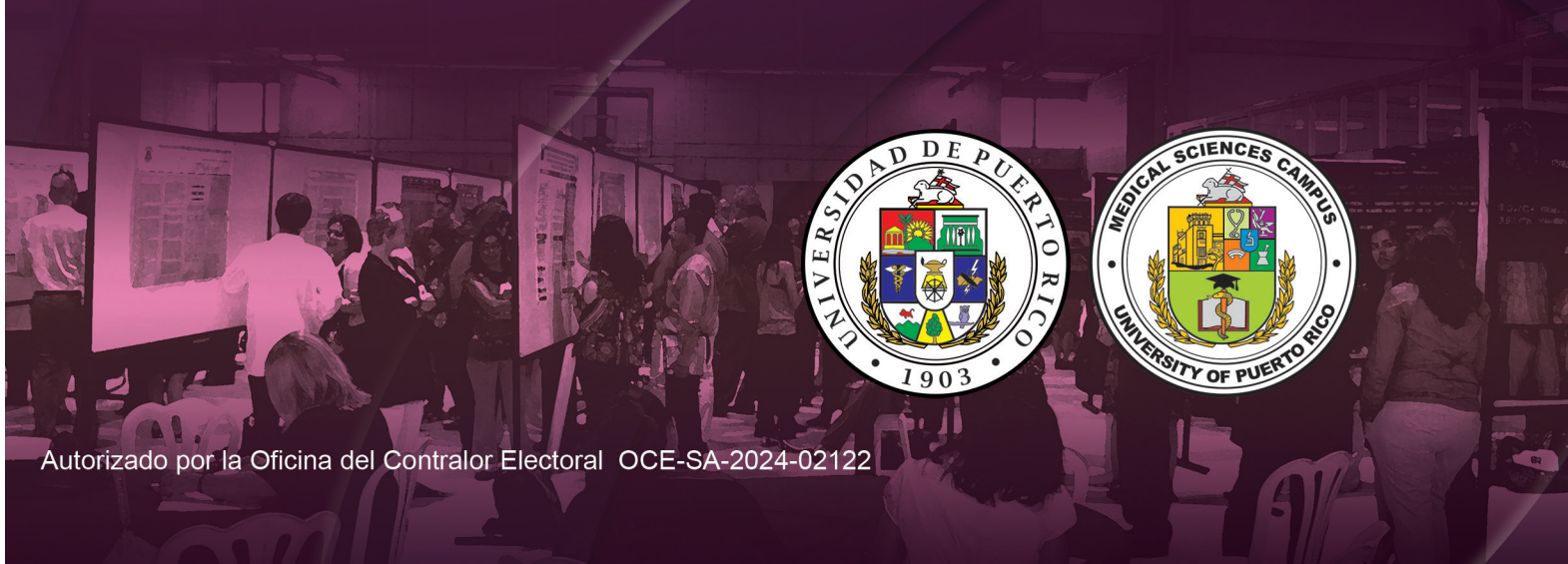

Biosketch

Dr. José A. Ortiz, a psychiatrist with 20 years of experience in mental health in Puerto Rico, earned his Doctor of Medicine degree in 2000 from the University of Puerto Rico School of Medicine. He completed his Psychiatry Residency Program in 2004, serving as Chief Resident in his final year. With extensive clinical experience spanning outpatient to inpatient care, Dr. Ortiz has excelled in both governmental agencies and premier private institutions. His administrative roles include Faculty President and Director of Medical Utilization at First Hospital Panamericano. Since 2013, he has consulted for MSO of Puerto Rico's Integrated Mental Health Department, now serving as its Medical Director. In 2022, following his receipt of the 2020 MSO of Puerto Rico Excellence in Innovation Award and the 2023 MMM Corporate Citizenship Award, he assumed the role of Corporate Medical Director of Mental Health. Dr. Ortiz is Puerto Rico's sole psychiatrist certified by the American Board of Quality Assurance and Utilization Review Physicians, with sub-specializations in Physician Advisor and Patient Safety. He's pivotal in developing clinical programs like Care Transition and Burnout Prevention, uniquely benefiting providers in Puerto Rico.



Conference Summary

In a continuous pursuit of innovation for the health and well-being of our community, the Integrated Mental Health Department is proud to have established two pivotal programs: the Burnout Program and the My Emotions App.

The Burnout Program addresses the increasing stress and burnout healthcare providers face. This challenge has become all too familiar in today's fast-paced environment. This comprehensive initiative encompasses structured activities such as data collection on stress factors, creating in-depth profiles for each provider, and implementing targeted interventions. It also includes a robust educational framework and training to equip providers with the tools to manage and mitigate circumstances that typically lead to burnout.

Parallel to this, we have introduced the My Emotions App, a digital tool developed by MMM's Integrated Mental Health Department, which symbolizes a significant leap forward in providing our members with autonomous access to mental health and substance abuse screenings. This app allows members to complete screenings at their convenience, using any smart device, and immediately receive personalized feedback based on their responses. It also directly links to our mental health call center, ensuring members are only a touch away from professional support.

Should the app identify a member as being at risk, it triggers an alert within our call center. This prompt enables our representatives to reach out via telephone to assess the member's condition, verify the level of risk, and, if necessary, arrange for the appropriate subsequent level of care. This seamless integration of technology and personal touch guarantees that our members receive comprehensive care that is immediate and attuned to their needs.

Dr. Paul Harris, is professor of biomedical informatics, biostatistics, and biomedical engineering with extensive experience working in the field of clinical and translational research informatics. Dr. Harris serves as director of the Vanderbilt University Medical Center Office of Research Informatics and is very active in the NIH Clinical and Translational Science Award (CTSA) informatics community. He serves as Principal Investigator for the NIH All of Us Program Data and Research Center housed at Vanderbilt University Medical Center. He also serves as Principal Investigator for the NIH/NCATS Recruitment Innovation Center.

Conference Summary

Dr. Harris will delve into the latest advancements and future directions of the All of Us Research Program, focusing on the expanded opportunities for researcher access. This is especially relevant and significant for the UPR Medical Sciences Campus as it has received an award for the 2023-2024 All of Us Data Training and Engagement for Academic Libraries Program. Additionally, Dr. Harris will provide an insightful overview of the REDCap Consortium, which began as a collaboration between Vanderbilt University Medical Center and the UPR Medical Sciences Campus, highlighting its evolution from its inception as a collaborative project to its current status as a pivotal resource in research data management. Attendees will understand how these initiatives are shaping the landscape of health sciences research and data management and how the UPR Medical Sciences Campus involvement in the All of Us Program and REDCap Consortium plays a crucial role in advancing these fields.

Medical Ethics and Miraculous Treatments: Medical Professionalization in Puerto Rico at the Beginning of the 20th Century (Conferencia en español)

Biosketch

Dr. Mariola Espinosa, Associate Professor at the University of Iowa, specializes in the history of medicine and public health in Latin America and the Caribbean. With degrees from Princeton University and the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, her work focuses on disease, race, and medicine within the context of empires. Her notable publication, *Epidemic Invasions*, highlights the impact of yellow fever on Cuba-U.S. diplomatic relations. Espinosa's research, supported by the National Endowment for the Humanities, extends to the production of medical-scientific knowledge in imperial peripheries and examines the professionalization of medicine's ties to politics in the Spanish-speaking world.

Conference Summary

At the end of the 1920s, amid reports on the visit of delegates from Puerto Rico to Washington, D.C. and the anticipated arrival to the island of the new governor, Theodore Roosevelt, Jr., Puerto Rican newspapers began to cover news about doctors achieving miraculous cures. The method of the Spanish doctor, Fernando Asuero, had reached the island and, like Asuero, prominent Puerto Rican doctors claimed they could cure everything from rheumatism to paralysis with a simple touch of the trigeminal nerve. Others argued that practitioners of "Asuerotherapy" were exploiting public credulity and ridiculing the medical profession. This presentation documents how Puerto Rican doctors addressed this controversy by defining the relationship between scientific knowledge, medical ethics, and the practice of medicine. It describes the efforts of the Puerto Rico Medical Association to advocate for and publicly establish its role as the authority on the self-regulation of medicine.

Impact of Vector-Derived Factors on Parasite Establishment and Determinants of Vector Infection and Transmission

Jesús G. Valenzuela, PhD

Biosketch

Dr. Jesús G. Valenzuela has revolutionized the field of vector-borne diseases through his pioneering research, notably in understanding the molecular dialogues between blood-feeding insects, pathogens, and human hosts. With a Ph.D. in Biochemistry from the University of Arizona, Valenzuela's illustrious career at the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases includes his appointment as Deputy Chief of the Laboratory of Malaria and Vector Research. His seminal work includes identifying salivary proteins from sand flies that mitigate *Leishmania* parasite survival, revealing critical parasite-vector interactions, and discovering a novel parasite developmental stage. Dr. Valenzuela's research has led to potential anti-*Leishmania* vaccines and novel epidemiological markers for vector exposure. His work is widely recognized and substantially impacts global health. Valenzuela's dedication to science extends beyond research, as evidenced in his roles as a plenary speaker at prestigious international conferences and his recognition with awards such as the NIH Director's Award, highlighting his contributions to medical entomology and public health.

Conference Summary

Dr. Valenzuela's presentation will address questions related to the molecular interactions between blood feeding insects and human skin, and between blood feeding insects and the pathogen they transmit. It will discuss how a *Leishmania* parasite takes advantage of some blood components when inside the sand fly gut and how these interactions result in a more infectious parasite. This research has also led to the discovery of a new parasite stage. The presentation will address studies of the components present in saliva of blood feeding insects and how these molecules affect human skin immune response and promote pathogen establishment. It will also present Dr. Valenzuela's efforts to move basic research findings to translational research activities, including human clinical research and field studies.

Strategies to Stabilize Dentine-bonded Interfaces: From Bench to Clinic

Biosketch

Dr. Salvatore Sauro is a distinguished professor in dental biomaterials and minimally invasive dentistry, with roles across several prestigious institutions worldwide, including CEU-Cardenal Herrera University, King's College London, and universities in Moscow, Naples, Bari, and Hong Kong. With a PhD from King's College London, his career spans over 15 years in dental biomaterials and minimally invasive dentistry research. He has also held the position of president-elect of the Dental Materials Group at the International Association of Dental Research and serves on the editorial boards of several journals.

Conference Summary

Modern, simplified, single-step dental adhesives have seen significant improvements in the last decade, yet they still face challenges like post-operative sensitivity, bond strength reduction, degradation, and biocompatibility issues. The hybrid layer's (HL) degradation occurs mainly through enzymatic degradation of collagen fibrils and resin leaching, facilitated by trapped unbound water. Proteases like matrix metalloproteinases and cysteine cathepsins can degrade the collagen matrix, while hydrolysis can destabilize the resin-dentine interface. To preserve the HL, strategies such as removing unbound water and inhibiting enzymatic activity are advocated. Additionally, the therapeutic use of bioglass powders in air-abrasion procedures can interact with dental tissues, promoting remineralization and improving resin-dentine bond durability. The lecture addresses how to merge *in vitro* and *in vivo* findings to enhance the longevity of resin-dentine bonds and prevent secondary caries in adhesive restorations.

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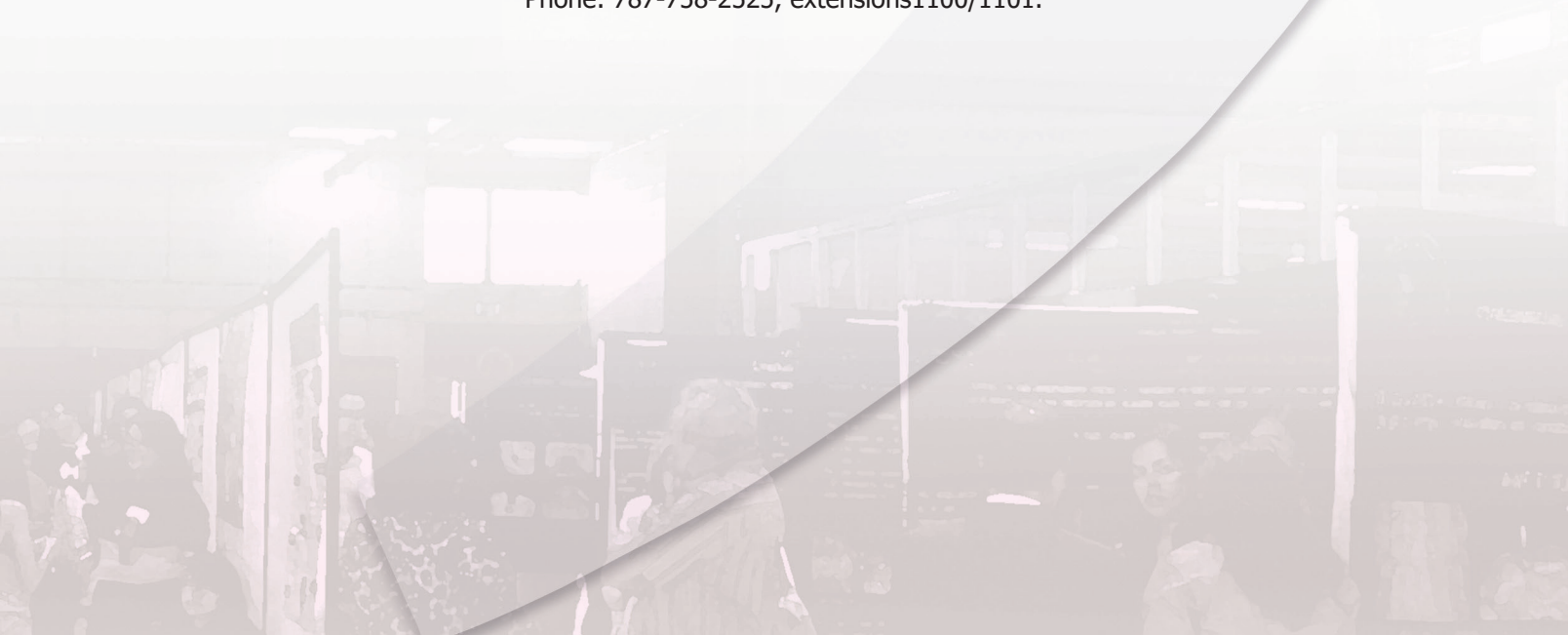
