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Executive Summary

This community health assessment contains data from 2000 to 2011. The main findings are:

- **Sociodemographic profile**

- The population of Puerto Rico decreased from 3,808,610 in April 1, 2000 to 3,725,789 in April 1, 2010. Population estimates for 2011 indicate that the population continues to decrease.
- The population structure of Puerto Rico got older. The population 65 years of age and older increased from 11.2% in 2000 to 15.2% in 2011.
- Between 2006 and 2010, there were 69,615 grandparents householders responsible for their grandchildren who were younger than 18 years of age.
- Nearly 31% of households in Puerto Rico had at least one person with 65 years of age or more.
- Almost 74% of household in Puerto Rico are family households. Among the latter, 60% are families of married couples.

- **Socio economic profile**

- During 2011, the median household income in Puerto Rico was \$18, 660, nearly half of Texas, which is the state with the lowest median household income (\$36,919.00).
- Male householders with no spouse present had the highest median family income.
- The labor participation rate decreased from 46.2% in 2000 to 40.5% in 2010.
- The unemployment rate was 16.1% in 2011.
- The poverty level for all people in Puerto Rico was 45.6%.
- Families of female householders without husband present are poorer than other types of family.
- A higher percentage of females have a bachelor degree or higher education than males.

- **Health profile**

- Live births rate decreased nearly 28% in the past 11 years.
- There was a slight increase of 4% in mortality rates.
- Between 2009 and 2010, there were only nine municipalities with an increase in their live births rates.
- In 2010, Mayaguez had more deaths than live births.
- The first three leading causes of death in Puerto Rico are heart diseases, malignant neoplasms, and diabetes mellitus.
- Cancer deaths are almost similar than deaths by heart diseases.
- Alzheimer's disease became the fourth leading cause of death during the decade, accounting for 6.4% of all deaths.
- In 2010, non-intentional accidents and homicides were among the leading 10 causes of death.
- From 2000 to 2010, non-intentional accidents and homicides accounted for 7.9% of all deaths that occurred during that period.
- The prevalence of overweight and obesity continued to increase during the decade.
- The prevalence of tobacco use had a decreasing trend; however, this changed in 2010.

- Since 2002, the prevalence of current asthma in women has doubled or almost doubled the prevalence of men.
- There are more incident cases of Chlamydia in females than males.
- During the first years of the decade, there have been more gonorrhea cases in males than females. However, this pattern changes during the decade.
- Primary and secondary syphilis incidence is higher in males.
- For both males and females HIV/AIDS cases, the age group with a higher proportion is 25 to 34 years.
- Dengue epidemics occurred in 1998, 2007, and 2010. Among these, the 2010 epidemic had the highest incident rate.
- The percent of the population who have a disability is 20.8%. Among people with 65 years of age or older, this percent is 51.7%.
- Health care access profile
 - In 2011, 7.6% of the non-institutionalized civilian population in Puerto Rico had no health insurance coverage.
 - By 2009, in 66 hospitals there were of 8,660 hospital beds in use.
 - For 2007-2010, there were 9,424 physicians in Puerto Rico; this represents a reduction of 4.5% since 2004.
 - There are two health insurance companies providing services to the population under Mi Salud, Puerto Rico's public health insurance.
 - The population covered by the public health insurance decreased in 2007, and since then has begun to increase.
 - The age group with the most public beneficiaries is the group aged 15 to 19 years, followed by age groups 10 to 14 years, and younger than 5 years of age.
 - Mi Salud has 488 Primary Medical Groups (PMGs).
- Mental health services profile
 - The median length of hospital stay in adults is 20 days.
 - The readmission hospitalization rate for non-forensic patients within 30 days is 10.1%.
 - During fiscal year 2011, the Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services Administration (served 21,039 patients for mental health services.
 - The prevalence of binge drinkers is higher in age groups 18 to 34 years.
 - The lifetime prevalence of marijuana use in 2008 for adults was 18.5%.
 - The second most used drug in adults is cocaine (6.9%), followed by sedatives (4.9%).
 - In adolescents, the prevalence of smoking a cigarette prior 13 years of age decreased from 12.8% in 1991 to 4.4% in 2011.
 - The highest prevalence of drug use in adolescents was in marijuana (10.2%), followed by inhalants (9.6%).

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I. Introduction

The mission of the Puerto Rico Department of Health (PRDH) is to promote and preserve the health of every human being in Puerto Rico to enjoy the physical, emotional and social well-being of a full life, and thus contribute to the productive and creative effort of Puerto Rico's society. This mission is anchored in the essential public health services framework. Within this framework, one of the public health activities is monitoring the health status of the population. This monitoring includes identifying and solving the health problems of the community. To do this, the PRDH needs the most current data available on the health and the associated socio-demographic and economic conditions of the people of Puerto Rico. For this purpose, the PRDH prepared the Puerto Rico Community Health Assessment, in collaboration with the Puerto Rico Institute of Statistics (PRIS). This partnership allows the PRDH to determine the public health priorities of Puerto Rico, while at the same time promotes the mission of the PRIS to ensure universal access to comprehensive statistical information on the Island. The Assessment consists of several sections:

- Socio-Demographic: Provides context to the current population situation of the island. The data for this section was obtained from the U.S. Census Bureau.
- Socio Economic: Presents data on topics such as income, earning, employment, poverty, and educational attainment. The data for this section is from the U.S. Census Bureau and the Puerto Rico Department of Labor and Human Resources.
- Health: Provides statistics on mortality, morbidity, maternal, and child health. Data for this section is from different divisions of the PRDH and the Puerto Rico-Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System.
- Health Care Access: The data for this section is from the U.S. Census Bureau, the Health Insurance Administration (ASES, in Spanish) and the PRDH.
- Mental Health Services: This data is from the Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services Administration (ASSMCA, in Spanish).

II. Socio demographic profile

The data of this section is from the U.S. Census Bureau.


A. Population estimates for Puerto Rico and municipalities

The population of Puerto Rico has undergone major changes in the last decade. Between 2000 and 2010, the population structure of Puerto Rico got older (See population pyramids of 2000, 2005, and 2010). The population of Puerto Rico decreased from 3,808,610 in April 1, 2000 to 3,725,789 in April 1, 2010. Population estimates for 2011 indicate that the population continues to decrease. For July 1, 2011, the U.S. Census Bureau estimated that the population of Puerto Rico was 3,706,690. Population pyramids for 2010 and 2011 show the differences in age structure from 2010 and 2011. From 2000 to 2011, 43 municipalities lost population; among these, Ceiba lost 25% of its population, while Guánica lost 13%. Among the municipalities that had an increase in population, Gurabo had the highest increase (25%).


Population 2000

B. Age distribution for Puerto Rico and median age of municipalities

In 2000, census data revealed that the median age of Puerto Rico was 32.1 years. The median age increased to 36.9 years in 2010. This represents an increase of 4.8 years in a decade, twice the increase registered for the United States as a whole. Furthermore, in 2011, the median age of the population was 37.4 years. The population 65 years of age and older increased from 11.2% in 2000 to 15.2% in 2011. Furthermore, the increase in population was higher in females than males. In 2000, there were 10.2% of males with 65 years of age and older; this percentage increased to 13.8% in 2011. In 2000, there were 12.2% of females with 65 years of age and older; this percentage increased to 16.5% in 2011.

For 2011, the municipalities with older populations are Hormigueros and Rincón with a median age of 42 years and 41.4 years respectively. In Culebra and Rincón, males have a median age of more than 40 years. However, in 18 municipalities females have a median age higher than 40 years. Moreover, in Hormigueros, the female population has a median age of 44.6 years; in Guaynabo and Vieques, females have a median age of 42.7 years and 42.4 years, respectively.

C. Sex distribution for Puerto Rico and municipalities

For 2011, females account for 52% of the population of Puerto Rico. All municipalities, except for Jayuya, Guayama, and Culebra, have a higher proportion of females than males. In these municipalities, the difference between males and females is less than 32 people. Currently, San Juan is the municipality with more population and females surpass males by 31,652. In this municipality, females account for 54% of the population. Currently, 53% of the population in Arroyo, Caguas, Carolina, Fajardo, Hormigueros, and Loíza are females.

D. Household composition for Puerto Rico and selected municipalities

During 2006-2010, there were 1,227,039 households in Puerto Rico; in 37% of them, there was at least one person younger than 18 years of age. On the other hand, 31% of households in Puerto Rico during the same period had at least one person with 65 years of age or more. The mean household size for Puerto Rico was 3.03, while the mean family size was 3.57. Among municipalities, Peñuelas had the higher percent of households with a person younger than 18 years of age (49.1%), while Hormigueros had the lower percentage (27.2%). Cabo Rojo had the highest percentage of households with at least one person with 65 years of age or more (38.2%), while Toa Alta had the lowest percentage (23.3%). Maricao has the highest mean for both household and family size (3.78 and 4.6, respectively). Finally, San Juan has the lowest mean household size (2.62) and Las Marías the lowest mean family size (3.11).

Almost 74% of households in Puerto Rico are family households. Among these, 59.7% of family households are from married couples and 32.5% are from females with no husband present. In 41.6% of the families, there is at least one child of their own. Additionally, among families of females without husband present, 50% of them have at least one child of their own. However, this percent drops to 40% among families of males without wife present. Among all families with at least one child of their own, females without husband present account for 39.1%. In Las Marías, 70.8% of families are married couples. In Cataño, 45.7% of families are females without husband present. Among the municipalities, Orocovis has the highest percent of (a) families with children (51.7%), and (b) families of males without a wife present (14.8%). Within the latter, Orocovis has the highest percentage of families of males without a wife present with children of their own (20.5%). Among families of females without husband present, Culebra has the highest percent of families of females without husband present with at least a child of their own (58.2%). Finally, among families of married couples Naranjito has the highest number of this type of family that has at least one child of their own (70.3%).

In Puerto Rico, 87.9% of nonfamily households are of one person living alone. Additionally, 36.3% of nonfamily households are of people with 65 years of age or older. In Hormigueros, 98.3% of nonfamily households are of people living alone, while Luquillo has the lowest percentage of nonfamily householders living alone (79.6%). Finally, Cabo Rojo has people with at least 65 years of age in 49.8% of their nonfamily households, while Gurabo only has 24.7% of this population group within nonfamily households.

E. Grandparents householders responsible for grandchildren: Puerto Rico and selected municipalities

In Puerto Rico, between 2006 and 2010, there were 69,615 grandparents householders responsible for their grandchildren who were younger than 18 years of age. In Culebra, 25 out of 29 (86.2%) and in Cayey, 1,383 out of 1,711 (80.8%) grandparents householders were responsible of their grandchildren, the highest rate of any municipality. The only municipality with less than 30% (347 out of 1,203) of grandparent householders responsible for their grandchildren younger than 18 years of age was Aguas Buenas.

III. Socioeconomic profile

The data of this section is from the U.S. Census Bureau and the Puerto Rico Department of Labor and Human Resources.

A. Income estimates for Puerto Rico and selected municipalities

During 2011, the median household income in Puerto Rico was \$18,660. The median family income for male householders with no spouse present was \$29,350; which was higher than the median family income of married couples of \$22,043. Finally, the lowest median family income was for female householders with no husband present (\$16,389). The median income of families headed by females was more than \$13,000 lower than for families of males. On the other hand, the median income of individuals was \$13,723. The median earnings of males and females that are full-time employees showed minimal differences (\$22,529 vs. \$22,117). Among households, 42.6% received incomes from the Social Security Administration and 37.5% received incomes from food stamp/SNAP benefits.

Among municipalities, Trujillo Alto has the highest percent of its individuals receiving earnings (73.7%). On the other hand, Quebradillas is the municipality with the lowest percent of its individuals receiving earnings (48.2%). However, Guaynabo is the municipality with the highest mean earning of individuals (\$59,035) and the highest mean household income (\$54,721) and the highest median household income (\$33,279). In contrast, Maricao has the lowest individual mean earnings (\$17,425), household mean income (\$15,294), and median household income (\$10,932).

B. Employment estimates for Puerto Rico and selected municipalities

From 2000 to 2011, in Puerto Rico, the labor participation rate decreased from 46.2% to 40.5%. Within the municipalities, Guaynabo had since 2000 a participation rate over 50%. However, this rate decreased from 56.4% in 2000 to 51.1% in 2011. For its part, Orocovis' already relatively low participation rate of 2000 (31.4%) decreased even further reaching 28.3% in 2011. In 2011, Las Marías had the highest participation rate (57.9%).

Regarding the unemployment rate, Puerto Rico had a rate of 15.7% in 2010, which increased to 16.1% in 2011. The municipality of Salinas had the highest unemployment rate in both 2010 and 2011 (25.3% and 25.2%, respectively). Finally, in 2011, Culebra and Guaynabo tied for the lowest unemployment rate (9.9%).

C. Poverty² level for individuals, Puerto Rico

In 2011, the poverty level for all people in Puerto Rico was 45.6%, while it was 41.7% in all families. Families of female householders without husband present are poorer (58.4%) than families of married couples (30.2%). Additionally, the poverty rate of families of females householders without husband present who have children under 18 years of age is higher than (68.6%) the poverty rate of married-couple families with children under 18 years of age (33.9%). Finally, the poverty rate of people who have related children younger than five years of age is 61.5%.

The poverty rate in all families was the highest in Orocovis (61.2%), while Guaynabo has the lowest (24.6%). The municipalities of Florida, Hatillo, Las Marías, Morovis, Quebradillas, and Vieques have 100% poverty rate within female householders without husband present that have related children younger than five years of age. The municipality of Adjuntas has the highest poverty rate among married couples, while Guaynabo had the lowest poverty rate (14.8%). Las Marías has the highest poverty rate among families with female householders without husband present (82.7%), while Hormigueros has the lowest (39.4%). Maricao has the highest poverty rate among all people (64.7%) and in people younger than 18 years of age. On the other hand, Guánica has the highest poverty rate among people with at least 18 years of age (61.1%) and in people between 18 and 64 years of age (62.1%). Finally, 30 municipalities have a poverty rate over 50% in people with at least 65 years of age; among these municipalities, Maricao has the highest poverty rate (63.5%).

D. Educational attainment for population 25 years or more, Puerto Rico and selected municipalities

More than 70% of the population over 25 years of age has at least high school. Furthermore, a higher percentage of females have at least a bachelor degree when compared with males (26.6% vs. 19.5%). There are 19 municipalities with a percentage of 40% or more of people without high school diploma (Vega Alta, Hatillo, Camuy, Vega Baja, Añasco, San Lorenzo, Morovis, Rincón, Adjuntas, Orocovis, Aguada, Comerío, Maunabo, Lajas, Ciales, Lares, Maricao, San Sebastián, and Las Marías). Among these, Las Marías has the highest percent (50.7%) of people without high school diploma. Finally, Trujillo Alto (31.7%), San Juan (31.9%), and Guaynabo (40%) are the only municipalities in which at least 30% of their population over 25 years of age has a bachelor degree or more.

IV. Health profile

The data of this section is from the Puerto Rico Health Department and the Behavioral Risk Factor System (BRFSS).

A. Vital events

During the last 11 years, there were dramatic changes in the vital events rates. Live births rate decreased nearly 28%, from 15.6/1,000 people to 11.3/1,000 people. During that period, there was a slight increase of 4% in mortality rates, and a decrease in infant mortality rates. Maternal death rates have been unstable during this period; the lowest rate was in 2006 (4.1/100,000 live births), and the highest in 2000 (20.2/100,000 live births). Fetal death rates decreased 6.4% during these years. However, the rate of infant mortality is 8.2/1,000 live births and the rate of fetal deaths was 10.2/1,000 live births and fetal deaths in 2008. This rate is almost 2 times higher than the target of Healthy People 2020. Finally, while marriage rates decreased 33.5% during the period, divorced rates remained stable with a small reduction of 0.8%.

Births

In Puerto Rico, between 2009 and 2010, there were only nine municipalities (Cabo Rojo, Canóvanas, Guánica, Guayanilla, Hormigueros, Patillas, Peñuelas, Vieques, and Yauco) with an increase in their live births rates. Among these, Hormigueros had the highest increase (11%). However, Rincón and Maricao had the highest decrease in live births (30% vs. 31%). For 2009 and 2010, we calculated a birth-death rate difference to determine the natural increase of the population. Additionally, we calculated a birth-death ratio to determine net births in each municipality. In 2009, the lowest birth-death rate difference occurred in Arecibo (73.3), while the highest was in Maunabo (870.8). In the same year, Toa Alta had the highest birth death ratio, with 2.7 births for every death. In 2010, preliminary data showed that Peñuelas had the highest birth-death rate difference (743.3). Toa Alta remained with the highest birth-death ratio with 2.4:1. On the other hand, Mayaguez had a dramatic decrease in live births; the birth-death rate difference was -6.8 and the birth-death ratio was 0.99:1. The latter means that Mayaguez had more deaths than live births in 2010.

a) Maternal and child health

Healthy People 2020 have several objectives for this area. One of these objectives is to decrease low birth weight to 7.8%. Another main target is to decrease infant deaths to 6.0/1,000 live births. In addition to these measures, this section presents data related to teenage mothers.

(1) Teens birth rate for Puerto Rico and selected municipalities

In 2009, Vieques had the highest proportion of teenage mothers (34.9%), while Guaynabo had the lowest proportion (12.9%). Preliminary data for 2010 shows that Vieques remains with the highest proportion of adolescent mothers (27.7%) and Culebra had the lowest proportion (5%). Finally, Guaynabo had the second lowest rate of teenage mothers (11.2%).

(2) Infant with low birth weight for Puerto Rico and municipalities

In 2010, there were 12.6% of infants born with low birth weight. In the same year, the municipalities with the highest proportion of low birth weight newborns were Maricao (27.3%) and Maunabo (18.2%). Dorado had the lowest proportion of low birth weight (7.8%). Finally, Aguas Buenas, Arecibo, Canóvanas, Guaynabo, Las Marías, Manatí, and Vega Baja had more than 20% of newborns with a birth weight over 3,500 grams.

(3) Infant mortality rate for Puerto Rico and selected municipalities

In 2008, the infant mortality in Puerto Rico was 8.8 per 1,000 live births. In the same year, Hormigueros had the highest male infant mortality rate 63.8/1,000 live births, while Humacao has the lowest (2.6/1,000 live births). Female infant mortality rate was higher in Culebra (66.7/1,000 live births), while the lowest was in Isabela (2.1/1,000 live births).





B. Mortality

The first three leading causes of death in Puerto Rico since the 1990s are heart diseases, malignant neoplasms, and diabetes mellitus. However, during this decade, heart diseases have decreased. For 2010, preliminary data showed that the difference between deaths by heart diseases and malignant neoplasms are 13 cases. Alzheimer's disease is the fourth leading cause of death, accounting for 6.4% of all deaths. In 2010, non-intentional accidents and homicides were among the leading 10 causes of death, which in combination accounted for 6.8% of all deaths. This percentage is higher than Alzheimer's disease. In 2010, the municipality of Lajas had the highest age-adjusted death rate (1,034/100,000 people), while the municipality of Toa Alta had the lowest age-adjusted death rate (458/100,000 people).

1. Cancer

Deaths by cancer have increased throughout the years. In 2010, the leading death by cancer were malignant neoplasms of the colon, rectum and anus (18.1/100,000 people) followed by malignant neoplasms of trachea, bronchus and lung (16.5/100,000 people). However, deaths by cancer differ among males and females. The leading causes of cancer deaths in males are (a) malignant neoplasm of prostate (23.2/100,000 males), (b) malignant neoplasms of trachea, bronchus and lung (23.2/100,000 males), and (c) malignant neoplasms of the colon, rectum and anus (21.1/100,000 males). In females, the leading causes of cancer death are (a) malignant neoplasm of ovary (15.3/100,000 females), (b) malignant neoplasms of corpus uteri and uterus, part unspecified (10.4/100,000 females), and (c) malignant neoplasm of cervix uteri (6.7/100,000 females).

2. Violent deaths

From 2000 to 2010, there were 13,160 accidents, 8,758 homicides, and 3,220 suicides, accounting for 25,138 violent deaths during the period. This total represents 7.9% of all deaths occurring from 2000 to 2010. Annually, the number of violent deaths and its corresponding rate has diminished. However, there are marked differences of deaths by cause. During these years, the unadjusted death rate by accidents decreased from 38.7/100,000 people in 2000 to 27.6/100,000 in 2010, a decrease of 28.6%. On the other hand, unadjusted homicide rates increased from 18.4/100,000 people in 2000 to 26/100,000 people in 2010; a 40% increase. Although the unadjusted rates of accidents and homicides differed considerably during 2000, in 2010 their unadjusted death rates were similar. Finally, unadjusted suicide rates decreased from 8.3/100,000 people in 2000 to 7.7/100,000 people in 2010; a 6.7% decrease.



C. Morbidity

The following subsections will contain data related to the prevalence of risk factors and diseases, as well as data on disability, tuberculosis, and sexually transmitted diseases.

1. Risk factors

The prevalence of overweight and obesity has increased since 1996. This prevalence has always been higher in men than in women. In 2011, the prevalence of overweight and obesity in Puerto Rico was 66.1%; with men surpassing women by 10 percentage points. Additionally, 47.3% of the population indicated that they did not have physical activity in the last month; this percentage is higher in women than in men (54.2% vs. 39.6%). The prevalence of tobacco use in 2011 was 14.8%. However, men reported a higher tobacco use (20.8%) than women (9.4%). Since 1996, the prevalence of tobacco use had a decreasing trend; however, this changed in 2010. It is noticeable, that since 2001 the prevalence of tobacco use in females remained steady.





2. Overview of diseases


In 2011, 19.7% of the population indicated having arthritis; the prevalence was higher in women (25.3%) than in men (13.4%). Additionally, women reported a higher prevalence of depression (18.5%), diabetes (14.2%), current asthma (13.2%), coronary heart disease (7.6%), and COPD (4.0%) than men did. Since 2002, the prevalence of current asthma in women has doubled or almost doubled the prevalence of men. Regarding diabetes, except in 2008, the prevalence has always been higher in women than in men. Since 1997, the prevalence of hypertension has been higher in women than in men; however, in 2009, the prevalence of women and men only showed 1.4% percentage points of differences. From 1997 to 2009, the prevalence of hypertension increased almost 14 percentage points.

Prevalence of Current Asthma, PR 2002-2010







Prevalence of Hypertension, Puerto Rico selected years

3. Sexually transmitted diseases (STD)

There are more incident cases of Chlamydia in females than males. There were 2,695 new cases in 2000, and it virtually duplicated to 5,995 in 2010. However, in 2007 and 2009, there were more than 7,000 new cases reported. In these years, the female-male ratio was 6:1 and 5:1, respectively. It is noticeable that the incident rate of Chlamydia increases exponentially by age group. The incident rate of gonorrhea decreased over the years. However, this has a much lower incident rate than Chlamydia. During the first years of the decade, there have been more gonorrhea cases in males than females. However, this pattern changes during the decade. The incidence rate of herpes has increased through the years. Currently the female-male ratio of new cases of herpes is 3:1. New cases of genital warts also increased during the decade. Currently the incidence female-male ratio is 19:1. Finally, *trichomonas vaginalis* incidence had a seven-fold increase.

Primary and secondary syphilis incidence is higher in males. The female-male ratio is 1:19. There has also been a decrease in new cases of late latent syphilis. The incident rate is higher in males than females. Finally, the incident rate of congenital syphilis decreased dramatically in the past years.

4. HIV/AIDS

San Juan has the highest amount of HIV/AIDS cases. For both males and females HIV/AIDS cases, the age group with a higher proportion is 25 to 34 years. The most common method of transmission in males is injection drug use, while in females is heterosexual contact. In children younger than 13 years of age, the most common transmission method was their mother. Finally, the case fatality rate for HIV/AIDS cases has decreased to less than 5%.

5. Dengue fever

The incident rate of dengue fever has been variable since 1995. Epidemics occurred in 1998, 2007, and 2010. Among these, the 2010 epidemic had the highest incident rate (572/100,000 people), and a fatality rate of 100% of dengue hemorrhagic fever cases (33 cases). The epidemic of 1998 had an incident rate of 460/100,000 people and a fatality rate of 5.2% (9 out of 173 cases of dengue hemorrhagic fever). In 2007, Puerto Rico the incident rate of dengue fever was 291/100,000 and a fatality rate of 18.8% (9 out of 48 cases of dengue hemorrhagic fever).






D. Population with Mi Salud insurance

Currently, there are two health insurance companies providing services to the population under Mi Salud, Puerto Rico's public health insurance. Triple S (SSS) and Humana administrate eight health insurance regions, covering the 78 municipalities. These regions are 1) North, 2) Metro North, 3) San Juan, 4) North East, and 5) West, which are under SSS, and 6) East, 7) South East and 8) South West, which are under Humana.



The population covered by the public health insurance decreased in 2007, and since then has begun to increase. According to April 2012 data, the sex distribution of the public insured population is 54.8% females and 45.2% males. The age group with the most public beneficiaries is the group aged 15 to 19 years, followed by age groups 10 to 14 years, and younger than 5 years of age. The age groups with the lowest proportion of public beneficiaries is the group 70 to 74 years of age (1.1%), followed by those with 60 to 64 years of age (1.8%), and those with 75 years of age and older (2.1%). Therefore, as age increases, by 30 years of age, fewer amounts of people have Mi Salud. Among health insurance regions, the West and the East have a higher proportion of public insured. San Juan and the North East Region have the lowest proportion of public beneficiaries.

E. Mi Salud Primary Medical Groups (PMGs) and providers

Mi Salud has 488 Primary Medical Groups (PMGs); the West Region has 92 PMGs, followed by the North Region (83). San Juan Region has the lowest amount of PMGs (27). Currently, four regions (East, West, Metro, and North) account for 61% of all public beneficiaries. The East region has the most beneficiaries (255,746).

Although San Juan is the region with the least amount of beneficiaries, has the greatest numbers of psychiatrists (58), psychologists (27), and laboratories (136). On the other hand, the East region has the highest amount of primary physicians (314) and the West region the highest amount of specialist physicians. Metro North region has the highest amount of dentists (201) and X-rays (86). It is noticeable that the rate of providers per 10,000 beneficiaries is less than one for psychiatrists in South East and West region. The same situation occurs for X-rays, in which there is less than one X-rays service per 10,000 beneficiaries in the South East and South West regions.

F. Services used by people with Mi Salud insurance

In 2011, nearly 65% of people hospitalized were females. The East, Metro-North, North, and West Region had the highest proportion of hospitalization (between 14.1% and 15.8%). Among age groups, 18.7% of the hospitalizations occurred in people between 20 to 29 years of age, followed by people younger than 10 years of age group (18.4%). The population with the lowest amount of hospitalizations were those with 80 years of age and older.

Most of the patients who went to an emergency room (ER) were females (58.1%). Similar to hospitalizations, the East, Metro-North, North, and West Region had the highest percentage of patients visiting the ER. The age group with the highest proportion of patients visiting an ER was children younger than 10 years of age (24.87%), followed by people between 20 to 29 years of age (17.1%). The population with the lowest amount of hospitalizations were those with 80 years of age and older.

From 2008 to 2011, there was an increase in patients receiving services due to anorexia nervosa. This disease occurred mostly in females between 10 to 19 years of age. Data by region showed that most cases occurred in the Southeast region. Cases of bulimia nervosa increased between 2008 and 2009. Similar to anorexia nervosa, the South East region had the highest amount of cases of this disease.

VI. Mental health and substance abuse services profile

The source of data for this section is the Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services Administration (ASSMCA, in Spanish), the Behavioral Risk factor Surveillance System, and the Youth Risk Surveillance System.

A. Total number of licensed facilities offering mental health services

There are 449 licensed facilities for the provision of mental health services. Most of them are nonprofit organizations.

B. Characteristics of mental health measures

The penetration rate of services of ASSMCA is 5.99 per 1,000 population. The median length of hospital stay in adults is 20 days. The readmission hospitalization rate for non-forensic patients within 30 days is 10.1%. Additionally, 20% of the patients served have a dual diagnosis of severe mental illness and substance abuse; in children, this dual diagnosis occurred in 14% of patients.

C. Total number of clients served by ASSMCA

During fiscal year 2011, the Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services Administration (ASSMCA, in Spanish) served 23,560 patients for mental health services. Most of the patients were males (51.6%), and 65% of them had between 21 and 64 years of age. Most patients received services in community settings. Over 2,500 patients received services in a state psychiatric hospitals and over 21,039 received services in community programs. Non-forensic patients, males and females, had similar readmission rates within 30 days after being discharged from the psychiatric hospitals. Most patients were males. During fiscal year 2012, ASSMCA served 43,145 people; 68% were males. Among all patients served, 36% received services in a mental health center. Additionally, state psychiatric hospitals provided services to 1,627 people, mostly males. Finally, there were 2,732 children receiving mental health services; 56% of these were males.

D. Adult substance use for Puerto Rico

The prevalence of binge³ drinkers is higher in age groups 18 to 34 years. On the other hand, the prevalence of heavy drinkers⁴ is higher among people 24 to 34 years or age. Throughout the years, males have had a higher prevalence of binge and heavy drinking than females. However, in the past years, there has been a slight increase in females binge drinkers.

Data from ASSMCA showed that in 2008, 59.4% of males and 39.2% of females indicated having used alcohol during the past year. In both genders, the highest prevalence was among people ages 18 and 34 years of age. This same age group had the higher percentage of any drug use and illicit drug use. The lifetime prevalence of marijuana use in 2008 was 18.5%. Males had a higher prevalence than females (26.4% vs. 11.3%). The second most used drug in adults is cocaine (6.9%), followed by sedatives (4.9%). The prevalence of controlled prescription use was higher in males and females 25 to 34 years of age (5.9% vs. 3.9%, respectively). Finally, all health regions had a high last year prevalence of marijuana use (4.3% to 8.6%); the Metro region had the highest prevalence (8.6%).

E. Adolescent substance use for Puerto Rico

The prevalence of smoking a cigarette prior 13 years of age decreased from 12.8% in 1991 to 4.4% in 2011. However, students in grades lower than 12th grade of high school reported a higher prevalence of early cigarette smoking. The prevalence of early smoker females in 11th grade is higher than in their male counterparts (6.0% vs. 3.9%). The prevalence of early smoking was higher in males in 9th grade than in their female counterparts (5.2% vs. 3.9%). The prevalence of daily smoking decreased from 5.5% in 2005 to 2.5% in 2011. The highest prevalence is among adolescents in 10th grade (3.1%). However, the highest prevalence of daily smoking in females is in 10th graders (4.15), while in males is in 11th grade (4.1%).

The highest prevalence of drug use was in marijuana (10.2%), followed by inhalants⁵ (9.6%). Students in 12th grade have the highest prevalence of marijuana use (17.2%). The prevalence of marijuana use in males in 12th grade is 11 percentage points higher than in females. The prevalence of inhalants use is higher among males and females of 10th grade (13.2% vs. 11.3%). The prevalence of prescription drug use is higher in females in 9th grade (4.9%), and males in 10th grade (7.7%). Finally, the prevalence of ecstasy and steroids use is the same; 11th graders have the highest prevalence.
